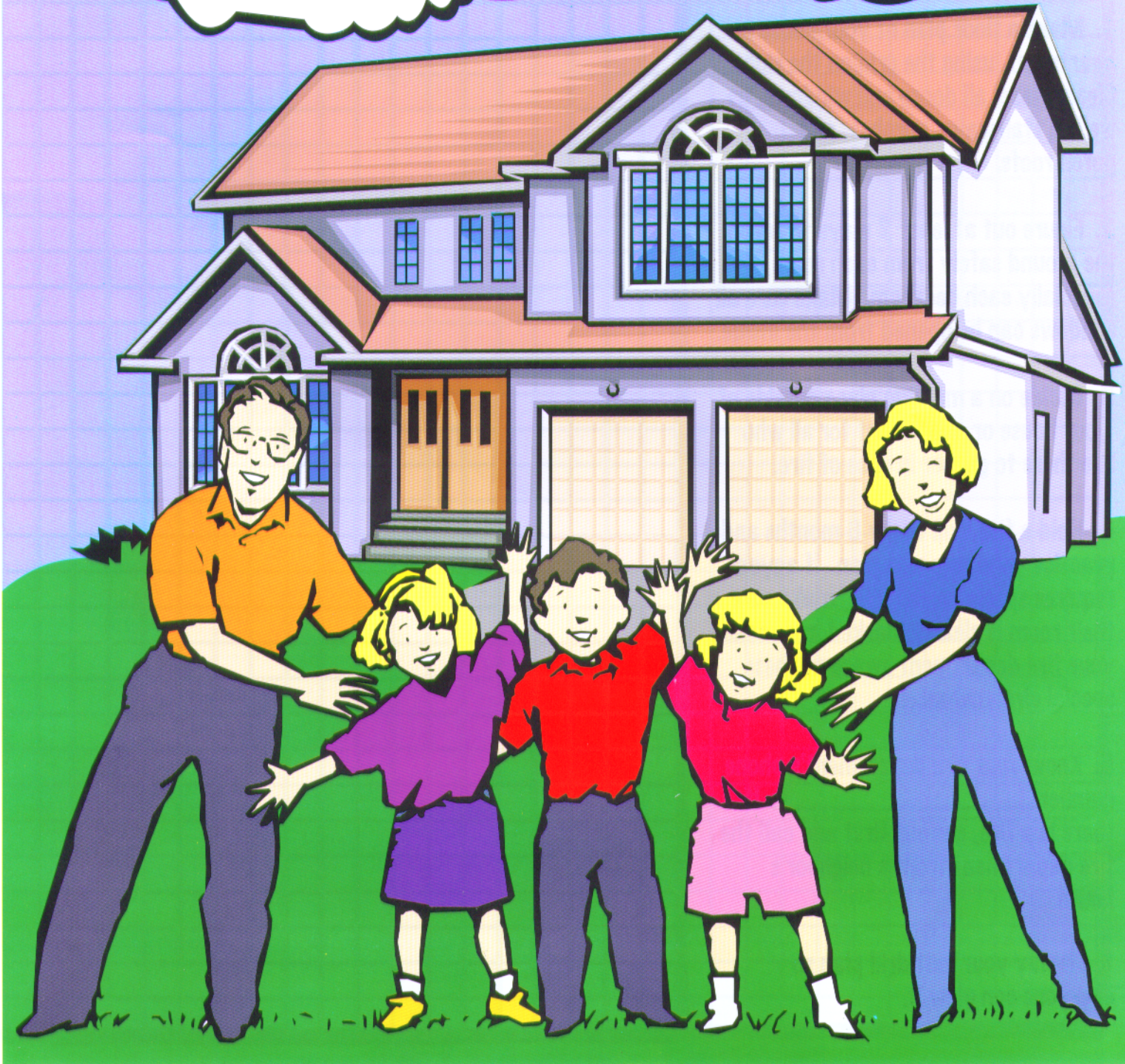


PLAN & PRACTICE FIRE EXIT DRILLS FAMILY EXIT PLAN





MY FAMILY

1. Make a floor plan of your house or apartment, using the grid on the right. Clearly label all doors and windows, as well as stairways, porches, and porch roofs.

2. Figure out at least 2 ways to reach the ground safely from each room, especially each bedroom. Make sure all windows can be opened from the inside.

3. Decide on a meeting place outside of your house or apartment for all who live there to gather in case of fire.

4. Hold a fire drill every 6 months and practice your new exit plan. If anyone requires special assistance, make sure their room is clearly marked and make your fire department aware of these special circumstances.

5. Know your fire department's phone number _____. If there is a fire, get out first and call the fire department from a neighbor's house.

6. Display your exit drill plan so everyone can view it.

**Practice your plan at least twice a year, during
warm weather and during colder weather.**

Be sure to practice using all alternate escape routes.
